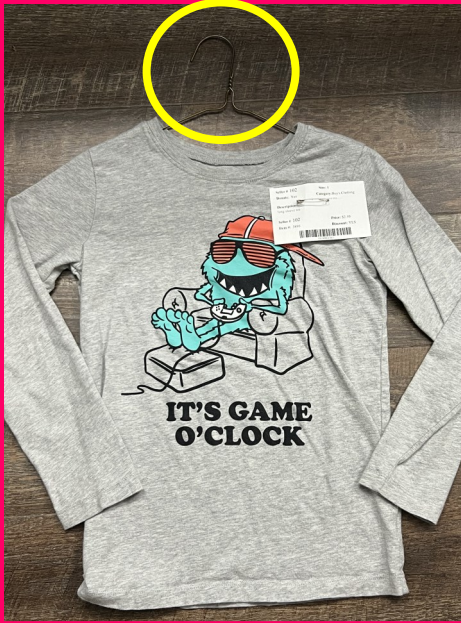
# Tagging Cheat sheet



Tags should be  
pinned  
**HORIZONTAL**,  
not vertical and  
can be pinned  
through the website

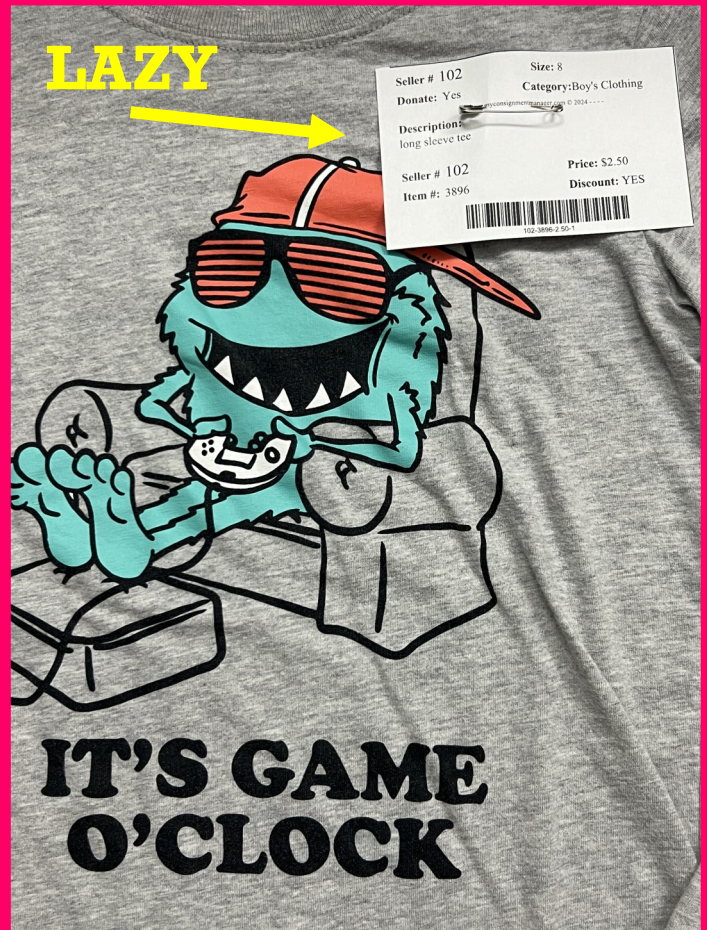
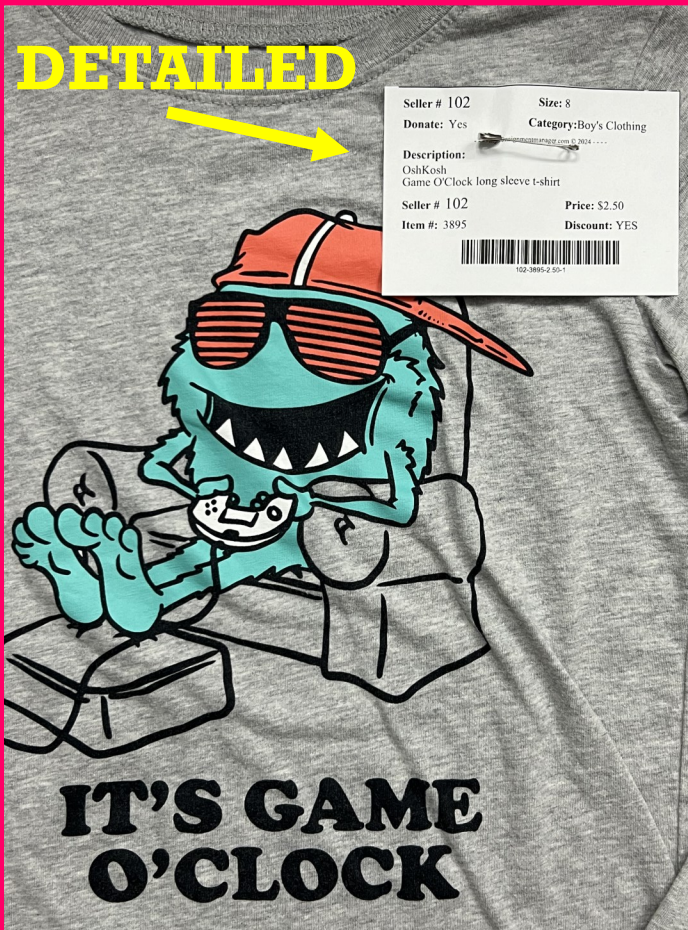
**HOW TO TAG PANTS**—pin close together at the top part of the hanger.





## ????? HANGERS ALWAYS LIKE A QUESTION MARK ??????

There are 2 tagging options—the DETAILED tagger or the LAZY tagger. If you are a detailed tagger, we have a much higher chance of matching your tag back to your item if they accidentally get separated during shopping. If you are a lazy tagger, you acknowledge that if your tag gets separated, we won't have the details to do much about it.

**For SETS and PAJAMAS, the shirt can go on the hanger, and the pants/shorts can be pinned behind through the shirt and to the hanger.**

**SHOES—all shoes MUST be in a ziplock bag!!**



- Walmart, Big Lots, and Amazon all sell large capacity ziplocks for boots and larger sized shoes.
- Make sure tags are taped with packing tape (the better the brand, the better it holds.) Make sure there are no bubbles over the bar code!!
  - If you tape the tag over the white part of the bag, you don't lose any additional visibility of your shoes. Shoppers buy products they can SEE.
- Taping bags SHUT reduces the risk of theft & items falling out of your bags.

BOOKS, DVDs, GAMES, ETC can easily be damaged by tags. Take great care when taping tags to these items. Painters tape works great. Try to tape in such a way that no important information is obstructed, especially the bar code.
